# **Defund Tide Is Turning**

ello everyone from RSA. Even though this message may not make it to print before Christmas, I want everyone to know I wish you



all a Merry Christmas and a very safe and happy New Year.

#### **DEFUNDING MOVEMENT**

These last few years have been extremely hard on our profession. It makes me proud to represent the RSA Membership, knowing that every one of you continues to show up each day to protect the residents of Riverside County despite our profession being under constant attack.

I am pleased to see that the tide is changing among some elected officials across California and the Nation in the few months. Many have come to the realization that "defunding" and not supporting law enforcement leads to more crime, and now many have changed their tune and are no longer promoting foolhardy ideas regarding public safety.

Defunding or dismantling the police means different things to different people, but essentially, those who called for it asked for money to be divested from the police and instead put into the community for mental health care and job development. While these are important, we also saw some of our "leaders" call for fully dismantling law enforcement as we know it while ignoring the risk. As crime has spiked

and their friends and families have become victims, these same politicians have quickly changed their tune and are now calling for more resources to prevent and investigate crimes.

#### **SICK TIME**

As I write this message, the County and the Department are seeing an increase in people getting sick – this is not new. Every winter, when people congregate inside, they often get sick with the flu. This flu season has brought on a new variant that can result in severe results for some, and of course, COVID in its various strains is still present. Regardless of what one's opinion is on getting vaccinated, we can all do our part to help stop the spread of any illness by maintaining good clean hygiene and not coming to work if you are sick.

I know it is hard to miss work when you are sick because the County imposed the term of sick time, not counting towards time worked for the purpose of overtime. While we have tried to return to the prior term of allowing sick time to count as time worked, the County Negotiating Team has refused to budge on this issue. We will continue our efforts to make this change, but please do your part and stay home if you are sick. Your partner's life is more important than higher pay for overtime hours.

While I know this may sound alarmist, one of our sister agencies recently had a member contract and then die from COVID complications. The death investigation determined the Officer most likely contracted COVID while at work around another employee sick with COVID. Long story short, you get four hours each pay period for sick time, so use it if you need it.

#### **SACRAMENTO**

We have had some big wins in the legislature and some unfortunate losses.

#### Biggest wins:

We successfully got SB 2, officer decertification, amended so that it was decidedly more livable than when it was first introduced and many of our issues were met.

We were successful in preventing AB 937, which would have completely prohibited when California agencies can share information with immigration authorities from coming up for a vote.

We provided critical amendments to SB 16, the officer records transparency bill, which we supported.

#### Biggest losses:

The Governor signed AB 333, which jeopardizes the DA's ability to use gang enhancements.

AB 481 established new requirements on how agencies fund, acquire, and use military equipment.

#### RELIEF FOUNDATION

Lastly, please start donating to the Relief Foundation. This can be done through your Association dues and will be used to directly help your partners, their families, and members of the community. The Relief Foundation has helped a number of our members, and it needs your donations to continue providing this assistance. As a donating member myself, I ask you to step up during this holiday and giving season and help your fellow members.

# **DENIAL: 30 DAYS** OR 90 DAYS?



LOWER COSTS WITH 30 DAYS?

he Workers' Compensation Insurance Rating Bureau (WCIRB) is a non-profit association composed of companies which provide Workers' Compensation insurance throughout California. The WCIRB, which has approximately 400 members, is not connected to the State of California, but its membership - consisting of insurance companies and third-party administrators - provides funding for the WCIRB.

The WCIRB maintains a review of costs and areas of coverage for jobrelated injuries. Recently, it issued a study of COVID-19 cases. The study showed that the number of COVID-19 cases which have been filed has changed over a period of time.

In the first four months of the current pandemic, more than 25,500 cases were filed state-wide. In July 2020, the number was up statewide and the infection rate was 10%. In November 2020, the infection rate had changed to 5%. A more recent finding in March 2021 indicated the infection rate had dropped further to 2% - a substantial drop from the first finding of 10%.

Also of significance is that COVID-related death claims have decreased. However, the WCIRB believes the death rate may increase for the rest of the year because of the tendency for death cases to be reported later. are sharing would indicate that the average cost of a COVID-19 case is about 48% less than the cost of non-COVID cases.

The report indicates that many of the COVID-19 cases filed were only for medical care; they were not seeking indemnification for time lost. However, the WCIRB acknowledges that the denial rate for COVID-19 cases is three times greater than denial rates for other types of injuries.

The information provided by the WCIRB appears to be very liquid, but the changes in COVID-19 cases is factual, and the WCIRB study does not give consideration for the "Long COVID" disease process and the actuality of that occurring at a later stage.

The findings of the WCIRB hopefully are reflective of changes in work conditions made by employers so that workers are less exposed to the coronavirus. These safer work environments are a product of employers being more educated as to what they can do to minimize COVID-19 exposures in the workplace for greater protection of their workers

The WCIRB acknowledges that the presumption legislated by Senate Bill 1159 in September 2020 is for the protection of firefighters, deputy sheriffs, Highway Patrol officers, police officers, probation officers and other health workers. The standard denial time for other injuries requires employers to respond within 90 days or the injury is presumed to be job-related. However, the COVID protection for safety officers requires employers to respond within 30 days. Without that denial, the COVID condition is presumed to be jobrelated. (This presumption still can be rebutted by certain factual patterns and information.)

The 30-day COVID rule for safety officers allows COVID-infected workers to obtain medical care at a faster rate than the 90-day rule does for non-COVID cases. This appears to be a factor which lowers costs for COVID cases as compared with non-COVID cases. The 30-day standard should be examined for other medical conditions as well as a possible opportunity to lessen costs for those cases. \*

# 2021 Successes & 2022 Opportunities

s 2021 draws to a close, the RSA has again solidified its position as the "must-have"

# RIVERSIDE CITY COUNCIL RECALL EFFORT

In late 2020, sone disgruntled Riverside city residents launched a recall effort against first-term city council member Gaby Plascencia, the successful 2019 candidate who was backed by both the Riverside Police Officers' Association and the RSA. As the gathering of signatures by the recall proponents moved forward, the RSA issued a press release in conjunction with the RPOA to inform voters that both law enforcement groups remained steadfast in their support of council member Plascencia.

Shortly thereafter, the recall effort fizzled, failing to obtain the needed signatures to place the recall before the voters. Numerous political insiders commented that it was RSA's

the RSA. Assistant Sheriff Delgado handily won the six-way race, was sworn into office last month by Sheriff Chad Bianco and is already preparing to seek re-election on the council in November, 2022.

public opposition to the recall effort which led many in the donor community to conclude that the recall's success was unlikely. This in turn, dried up campaign funding which prevented the recall committee from being able to raise the money necessary to pursue Plascencia's removal from office.



#### **2022 ELECTIONS**

It is clear that the RSA remains well positioned to help "make or break" a candidate's political future and in 2022, we will have a litany of opportunities to help candidates who prioritize public safety and are supportive of law enforcement efforts to protect the public.

Campaigns are expected to begin in earnest next month for an April 12 special election to fill two vacancies in Moreno Valley - one on the city council and one on the school board. As the largest contract city in the county, the importance of supporting city council members and candidates who support law enforcement and public safety cannot be overstated. The RSA has a successful track record when it comes to informing voters and advocating for candidates that recognize that the number one priority of government is the safety of its citizens.

Additionally, the campaigns for the June 2022 elections will also kick into high gear in January. The June primaries are less than six months away, and will be followed by the November 2022 general election just five months later, so it's going to be another very busy year.

Some of the Riverside County races we will be looking at next year include the offices of Sheriff, District Attorney, Board of Supervisors, Mayor, City Council, various school boards, state Senate and Assembly.

#### REDISTRICTING

With the drawing and implementation of new district boundary lines for the 2022, incumbent officeholders and prospective candidates will seek to connect with and persuade voters that they have never interacted with nor represented.

These boundary changes are extremely important because the new demographic statistics they create

indicate whether an incumbent will be forced to run against other incumbents or if a challenger is likely to be successful.

For example, due to new legislative redistricting lines, Riverside County Assembly members Jose Medina and Sabrina Cervantes are in the same assembly district - and to make matters worse, they are also joined in that district by Assembly member Eloise Reyes from Grand Terrace (San Bernardino County). Earlier this month, Assembly member Medina announced that he would not run for re-election, leaving the other two legislators to battle it out.

Similarly, Riverside County Supervisor Kevin Jeffries recently announced that he will not seek reelection in 2024. This district consists of the entire city of Riverside, Perris and a small portion of Jurupa Valley. Numerous politicos are already lining up to replace him and are seeking to secure endorsements and campaign contributions. As we get closer to that election, the RSA PAC will conduct candidate interviews and make endorsement recommendations to the Board of Directors in anticipation of supporting the candidate that is the most supportive of the work performed by the of the RSA membership which includes sheriff's deputies, corrections deputies, deputy coroners and district attorney investigators.

Across the state, there are dozens of districts where two or more incumbents must decide whether to run against each other or decline to seek re-election. These unusual competitions are caused by the once-a-decade work of the California Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission. When determining where to draw the new boundary lines, the Commission is prohibited from considering where incumbents or potential challengers live. The Commission oversees the drafting of new districts in our state for members of the Board of Equaliza-

tion, House of Representatives, state Senate and Assembly.

This is not usually the case with counties and cities where the elected leaders remain empowered to draw their own districts. This approach has been derided by some as "Representatives choosing their voters," rather than, "Voters choosing their representatives."

Still, even modest adjustments to city or county district lines can significantly impact an incumbent's likelihood of successful re-election. This is why the redistricting process is so frequently contentious at the local level - political careers created and cratered - depending on which group of voters are moved into - or out of - a district.

# INTERESTED IN RUNNING FOR OFFICE?

Next year will provide numerous opportunities for citizens with fresh ideas and diverse backgrounds to challenge the status quo and seek elective office. Additionally, 2024 will see many legislative seats open where no incumbent will be running, due to the 12-year term limits imposed by voters a little over a decade ago, offering even more possibilities for interested citizens to step up and become part of the solution to the problems that plague our communities.

Our cities, county and state are in desperate need of elected officials who will work to keep our communities safe. We strongly encourage RSA members, neighbors, friends and supporters to thoughtfully consider running for office. Please contact RSA leadership if you or someone you know is interested in seeking public office with a desire to improve public safety at the local, county or state level.



# A Father: There Will Be No Choices

or three days ... a vigil. Fate and faith at the optimum. But then three doctors called to ask all of my family members and Jerry's family to come to the intensive care unit at 6:00 pm. About 20 people attended.



The doctors' faces were grim. It was decision time. The decision was based upon progress in 3 days of constant effort to awaken the sleeping girl in the bed connected to a multitude of machines. Their sounds were rhythmical, constant, and incessant.

They were the sounds soft and steady coming from the bed of my sleeping beauty daughter, Michelle Lorraine. Her face immobile and peaceful... too peaceful. She was always vibrant, engaged, and eager. Now a strange placidity surrounded

the face of my "baby" girl. How could this be? Where was the laughing, engaging young lady, now quiet, distant, and removed from chatter and singing sentiment?

The crowd was silent, glum, and visibly anxious. We suspected only bad news for there had been no change in the physical, emotional, or spiritual usual effervescence of this beautiful child. She was a body supported by multiple tubes, pumping nutrients and oxygen to the whitened mask that showed no response for what seemed an eternity. An eternity of prayer, hope, and expectancy. Tears, based on talent, grace and love.

I shuddered as I looked at blank faces standing at the head of the miraculous engine of my "baby". They were the best trained in survivor skills so why was I so anxious? Fear for one thing, overcoming anxiety also. Hope for a scintilla of sunshine in her placid, yet still beautiful face.

After all, I was God's "faithful servant" for over 40 years. Surely, I was due some good news. The lead doctor

looked at all of us with a quiet empathy and said, "Family, for three days we have used every device and treatment known to medical science. At times we thought we saw progress and we redoubled our treatment on your precious child. Extended efforts by our teams of devoted doctors and nurses saw progress slowly slip into the background. Still, we did not stop at any time, even up to now.

"There have been several signs that the life force in Michelle is weakening, and deterioration is setting in. Our best, at first promising, is no longer on the positive and hopeful side. We are now forced to consider that it has become a herculean effort. At first promising, but now hope has faded. Therefore, the team of us, and all

I shuddered as I looked at blank faces standing at the head of the miraculous engine of my "baby". the nursing staff, have concluded once the several support machines are turned off, that Michelle will pass away. Do you have any questions?"

No one asked any questions. "Well, therefore, beloved family, it

has come to the decision to cease our intercession and let your sweet child return to God's loving arms.

"In keeping with the hospital's policy, we will ask a family member to turn off her life support. Medical staff is denied to do this final act and so do I have a volunteer?" There was a low volume mumbling as the room cleared up in an instant. I was suddenly alone with the three doctors and the two attendant ICU nurses.

I looked shocked at them. Their eyes focused on me. For a minute or two, it was completely silent. Then a doctor said, "Doctor Broviak, are you ready?" Panic set in. I was suddenly fearstricken and looking for an escape from this task which would end my daughter's fragile existence. There was no escape! I couldn't move. They stood silently, looking at me. I wanted to run! I couldn't do that! That would kill my little princess! I was ALONE! No one was there to support me! I kept shaking my head and motioning with my hands. No words came out. They continued



to look silently. Suddenly, a moment of panic seized me! I groaned! A sound I had never made before. It was an animal sound, not human! It shook my being. I was saying "No! No! No! No! No! No! Not just me! Oh Lord! Please! Not just me, please dear God, please?"

I started to shake, visibly torn by my rejection to end my little princess' life. What would I do without her? Who and what would take her place? I loved her without any excuse. She would never laugh at my corny jokes or come up and pinch my cheeks or put her head on my shoulder looking into my eyes, "I love ya dad." "I love ya popsy!"

A nurse came to me, hugged me long and looked into the waterfall of tears. "Come, I'll help. I'll be right there. You won't be alone. I'm with you, I can help!"

I don't know what happened next. I was on autopilot, shaking, fumbling, sobbing, looking for the door. I could run! I could escape! I don't know how to do this! The nurse wiped my eyes and face with tissues, hugged me again and held my face in her hands, looking with great love into my eyes. She took my hand and we moved to the head of the bed. I bent over, hugged and kissed my beautiful little girl! Sobbing "I'm sorry baby! I'm so sorry! Please forgive me! OH GOD! WHY ME?"

I turned the machine off and sat down on the floor with my nurse kneeling next to me. I was moaning and sobbing. I don't know how long. I wasn't there. I was somewhere in oblivion! Reality disappeared! There was no light, no floor, no ceiling, no persons, just me! I was a shadow. The room was a dream! My role a nightmare! My heart beating wildly, I felt would jump out of my chest. The sounds from me were not human. I denied they even came from me.

The nurse walked me to my car. My wife and son were inside. They made the same sounds as I did. They were hugging each other. I held the steering wheel in my hands and it seemed like hours! I do not remember the drive home. I don't remember anything about the succeeding two years. I was an automation, a moving meaningless blob that went to work each day. Who were those people in my house? What did I do? Pay bills? Shop? Sleep? Have intimate moments? Where was I? Who was I? Jerry? Who is she? My son! Harley? I'm sorry, who did you say you were?

All of this happened because her surgeon gave her the wrong medicine! My world died on that day. There were no choices! \*
