Always consult with an association representative/lawyer before responding to any report, letter, memo and/or questions concerning an investigation that could possibly lead to punitive action. If ordered to do so, ask to have it recorded and read the following: Non-waiver statement:

"I have been refused the right to have a representative of my choice. I understand that I am being ordered to make a report or answer questions and that, if I do not comply with the order, I may be disciplined for insubordination.

Therefore, I have no alternative but to abide by the order. However, by so doing, I do not waive my constitutional rights to remain silent under the 5th and 14th amendments to the United States Constitution and under the protections afforded me under state law."

RSA Joins The Fraternal Order Of Police

Hello from RSA; I hope this message finds everyone well. Upon approval of your

RSA Board of Directors, I'm happy to announce that RSA has joined the Fraternal Order of Police, FOP, as Riverside County Lodge 951.

The FOP is a combined voice for over 300,000 Law Enforcement Officers across the United States. This gives the members of RSA a voice at the national level. With our membership in the FOP, RSA members have access to all the supplemental benefits extended to FOP members. There are so many benefits, and I encourage you to log onto the FOP website (www.FOP.net) and find what benefits appeal to you and your family. Soon, RSA members will receive their FOP membership card in the mail.

Within a month of joining FOP, I had the opportunity to represent the RSA Membership on the National level. RSA was selected as a small group of FOP members who got to sit with the 55th Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, Kevin McCarthy, in a private meeting. The group also met with several other representatives to bring attention to several issues facing law enforcement across the Nation. RSA will continue to use this

platform to better the conditions for our active and retired members.

Our FOP Lodge is open to all active and retired members of Riverside County. If you are a member of another FOP Lodge on your own and wish to transfer your membership to our new Lodge, please get in touch with me at (951)538-4942, and we will help facilitate the change. We will send an invoice with the cost for our Retirees that want to join our new Lodge. This invoice can be returned with the fee, and we will add you to our Lodge membership. In the future, the FOP Lodge dues will be an option on your yearly RSA dues form. The FOP dues for retirees will only be what the State and National dues cost. RSA **does not** charge Lodge dues besides the State and National Lodge fees. All active members, your FOP dues are covered within your existing RSA dues, and there is no need to do anything additional.

MEDICAL CONTRIBUTIONS

In other big news, the County approved an increase in its medical contributions to employees who participate in an employee plus-one medical plan. RSA negotiated this as a contribution to our Benefit Trust for every member, not just the employee plus one individual. This money does not go directly to the member; it goes to the RSA Benefit Trust. The only requirement was that in the next benefit year, 2024, RSA's Benefit Trust would provide a no-cost employee plus one medical plan. Your trustees will comply with the requirement and are working hard to get to a position where we can offer a no-cost family plan soon. The key will be the subsequent negotiations with the County.

I know some will be upset with how this was negotiated; however, I'm confident this is what is best for our membership. The RSA Benefit Trust has absorbed the rate increases over the last twelve years. This means our

active members are paying the same premiums for medical insurance they were paying twelve years ago. This is unprecedented in the medical benefits world! The Benefit Trust also started a VEBA Health Savings Plan through the County's Plan, Gallagher, where the Benefit Trust gives the County \$80.00 a month for each active member. The Benefit Trust also provides the County \$20.00 a month, which is placed into a 401(a) for each active member. In addition the Benefit Trust contracted with Body Scan International to provide body scans for our active members at a rate of \$140. These are only a few things the Benefit Trust has done to provide our members with the best benefits possible.

For our Retired Members, we cannot use active money to offset your cost of medical insurance. Your Benefit Trust is exploring ways to provide options for our out-of-state retirees. These options would give our out-of-state retirees less expensive medical insurance plans. This will not happen overnight, but we are working hard to get it done.

SUCCESSOR CONTRACT

I have started to get questions about our next negotiations with the County for a successor contract. Our current Corrections and Law Enforcement Bargaining Units contract expires in December 2024. In the future, RSA will create online secure surveys for each bargaining unit to seek member input to form our top priorities going into our subsequent negotiations for each unit. When these surveys go live, I encourage each member to complete the survey and let your voice be heard. RSA will also pay to complete high-quality salary surveys for each position within each bargaining unit to ensure we understand what the market around us supports. RSA also maintains constant contact with all our surrounding agencies to ensure we have a complete and accurate understanding of their negotiated contracts and know their pay and benefits.

While discussing negotiations, I would like to explain the facts regarding a possible increase within the Corrections Bargaining Unit. Recently, the Department reached out to RSA and requested to meet and confer outside negotiations to increase the Cor-

rectional Deputy Trainee, Correctional Deputy I, and the bottom range of the Correctional Deputy II without changing the contract terms. When we met with the Department, we found their goal was to be able to offer higher pay to new Correctional Deputy Trainees. This allows the Department to be competitive with the private sector.

When the Department approached us, RSA immediately paid for a salary survey to confirm the data given to us by the Department. Our survey confirmed the Department's data and showed that the top of the range for our Correctional Bargaining Unit was above market. Despite this information, RSA offered new proposals to get everyone in the Unit new money. After several back-and-forth meetings, we found we successfully got all Bargaining Unit members, except 86 Correctional Corporals, new money. While we fought vigorously over this exclusion, we did not believe turning down additional money for over 1,100 members made sense because 86 members were not offered new money. During our next negotiations, we will prioritize getting extra money for the 86 Correctional Corporals.

I know the result of this negotiation will not sit well with some Correctional Corporals. However, as an Association of over 4,000 members, when negotiations reach an impasse, we must choose a result that will benefit most of our members. The negotiation process is never-ending, and we are constantly working behind the scenes to improve wages and working conditions for all. If you have further questions, please call me at the above number, and we can discuss them.

LEGISLATION

February 17th marked the bill introduction deadline in Sacramento, and in the coming weeks, we will better understand what challenges law

enforcement labor will face in this upcoming legislative session. Leading up to the deadline, over a thousand bills were introduced in one week, including AB 742, which would prohibit law enforcement K-9s from use in arrest, apprehension, and crowd control.

Another piece of legislation we are watching is the re-introduction of the state's planned response to new federal court rules on CCW licenses. Senate Bill 2 (Portantino) of 2023 – not to be confused with decertification – would set statewide parameters and restrictions around CCW licenses. Last year's bill failed by only a few votes on the Assembly Floor on the last night of the session. Governor Gavin Newsom and Attorney General Rob Bonta announced their co-sponsorship of the bill this week via a press conference. Law enforcement labor will continue, as we did last year, to provide our expertise and assessments on the details within SB 2.

FAILURE OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

Finally, I wrote and had published an op/ed in the *Riverside Press-Enterprise*, placing a spotlight on how law enforcement officers are being murdered in the line of duty because the criminal justice system is failing to keep in custody dangerous criminals with long records. One of the cases I highlighted was that of Deputy Isaiah Cordero, murdered because San Bernardino County Judge Cara Hutson inexplicably allowed the violent three-striker defendant who killed Isaiah bail while pending sentencing. 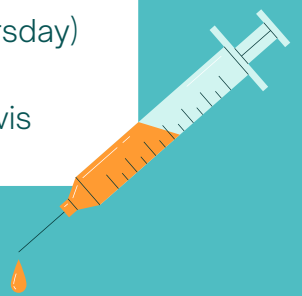
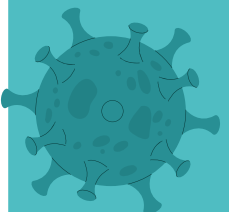
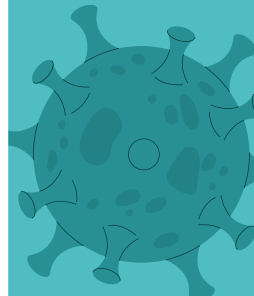

Newly Armed Correctional Deputy Training 830.1 P.C. Transition Course

The Newly Armed Correctional Deputy Training Transition Course has been implemented at the Ben Clark Training Center.

The two-week 830.1(c) Penal Code certified course is designed specifically for correctional deputies who travel armed during the course and scope of their employment. This role carries a significant amount of responsibility. There are a number of legal issues to consider.

Penal Code 835a(a) provides legislative intent with respect to an officer's decision and tactics during a use force, when it involves the use of deadly force. The course provides a foundation for students, encouraging them to be mindful of the totality of the circumstance when faced with a potentially deadly force situation.

Additional legislation seeks to guide the administrative and criminal investigative procedures following an officer involved shooting. Many of these legal issues are addressed and discussed during the course. To ensure that these legal issues are properly addressed, members of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Force Investigation Detail provided training regarding Department policy and the legal protocol for the criminal investigation process.

As a retired CHU/FID/PSB investigator, I have been participating in the course along with RSA General Counsel. Together, we provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the immediate legal guidance and support they will receive during the investigation following an officer involved shooting. ★

Big, Bad Bills

As the bill introduction deadline passed, more than 2,600

new laws have now been proposed for the nascent 2023-2024 legislative session. The Riverside Sheriffs' Association is actively lobbying on or closely monitoring over 250 bills so far this year.

We've come to accept that many misguided politicians will author bills sought by the myriad pro-criminal and anti-police interest groups flooding our state's capital with their dangerous, public threatening proposals and unfortunately, this new session will not be an exception. The worst so far are included below.

However, dozens of good bills have also been introduced and many seek to address the recent spike in crime. Some of these would re-establish appropriate penalties that were reduced or removed by Prop 47 and Prop 57. Others attempt to correct some of the more egregious "criminal reform" changes from the last decade that have protected criminals from the consequences of their actions. These legislative proposals are not expected to be supported by the current legislature that seems more focused on protecting dangerous felons than the communities and individuals these criminals victimize.

For example, AB 27 sought to restore a judge's discretion to determine whether a repeat, violent,

firearm-wielding felon should face an additional sentence enhancement for committing yet another violent, firearm-involved offense. None of the six Democrats on the eight-member Assembly Public Safety Committee supported this common sense bill. AB 27 died after receiving just two "yes" votes from the Republicans with

decades of relevant public safety experience. Both Assemblyman Tom Lackey, who retired from the CHP after 30+ years and Assemblyman Juan Alanis, who retired after serving more than 25 years as a deputy sheriff voted in favor of the bill. Tip of the iceberg.

Also concerning is that there will be even more dangerous and harmful bills



expected to be added to our list as soon as the dozens of “spot” bills (they save a legislative “spot” for the lawmaker to use at a later date) are amended over the next month. For now, we’ve prepared a quick summary of the most troubling bills put forth to date and divided them into four categories.

**SOFT-ON-CRIME/
SENTENCE REDUCTIONS**

These bills either reduce criminal sentences, or remove other types of punishment or discipline for those who refuse to follow our laws. The underlying belief by the authors of these bills is that poor, Black/Brown and disadvantaged persons are unfairly treated by the criminal justice systems and overly incarcerated which necessitates a reduction in punishment or time served.

AB 599 - no suspend/expel students who bring/use fentanyl, etc on campus

AB 600 - courts can recall, resentence and release dangerous inmates - anytime

AB 1310 - further sentence reductions for convicted violent gun felons

AB 1412 - expand pretrial diversion so criminals avoid a criminal record

AB 1466 - can’t suspend/expel students; no consequences for bad acts

AB 1497 - easier to plead incompetency & avoid punishment

AB 1523 - reduces sentences for convicted murderers

AB 1726 - expunges some prostitution & sex-related convictions, including felonies

SB 58 - legalizes “magic” mushrooms

SB 274 - no suspend/expel for students disrupting school activities

SB 749 - expands Prop 47 sentence reductions for more inmates

**LIMITING POLICE &
REDUCING PUBLIC SAFETY**

Bills listed in this section tackle “criminal justice reform” from a different approach - preventing peace officers from enforcing the law and from using effective tools to solve crimes and apprehend offenders. The authors here claim that “Black and Brown people are disproportionately impacted by the criminal justice system” and to address this inequity, police must be limited in their ability to arrest suspected criminals and performing their jobs be made more difficult.

AB 73 - no stop required at stop sign if driver feels its safe to proceed

AB 93 - police no longer to request consent to search

AB 391 - no investigation of anonymous tips reporting child abuse/neglect

AB 642 - limit/regulate law enforcement use of facial recognition tech

AB 742 - ban using police k-9 for arrest, apprehension, crowd control

AB 1028 - mandated reporting removed for medical professionals

AB 1034 - ban the use of facial recognition tech by law enforcement

AB 1082 - no impounding of vehicles for multi citations or no registration

AB 1299- defunds SROs, ban handcuffs and citations on campus

SB 2 - severely restricts law-abiding ccw-owners from carrying in public

SB 50 - bans “pretext” stops for broken brake/turn/head/tail lights, no registration, more

SB 377 - police must also wait 10 days to purchase firearms & can't buy “off-roster”

SB 400 - officers terminated for cause to be made public

SB 402 - police barred from responding to disturbing the peace, blocking sidewalks, drunk, drugged persons, illegal camping and panhandling. Non-sworn to be sent instead.

EVEN MORE OVERSIGHT

Advances the fallacy that sworn law enforcement officers are so problematic that they can't be trusted to do their jobs without even more layers of oversight.

AB 443 - inflexible police “bias” definitions

AB 807 - AG to investigate police uses of force resulting in death of armed suspects

AB 1090 - voters elect, but county supervisors can remove, sheriff from office

CODDLING CRIMINALS

Grants new “rights” to criminals and inmates, without regard to the impact on taxpayers or on the safety of the public or peace officers. Supporters of these bills assert that if criminals were treated better by police and society overall, they would be less likely to commit crimes in the first place and also less likely to re-offend upon release.

AB 280 - no solitary confinement for repeat, deadly offenders in prison or jail

AB 958 - gives inmate “right” to “intimate partner” visits

AB 994 - police must use preferred name and pronouns of arrestees

AB 1186 - no restitution payable by juveniles

AB 1209 - non-lawyers permitted confidential jail meetings with arrestees

AB 1266 - no warrant/misdemeanor for some failures to appear

SB 254 - media to interview, glorify inmates without restriction

SB 838 - criminals injured by police get taxpayer-funded victims comp

SB 441 - criminal discovery rules titled toward defendants

ACA 8 - inmates not required to work in prison/jail, now get minimum wage

ACA 4 - inmates in prison/jail allowed to vote

As you can see, the 2023-2024 legislative session is shaping up to be an incredibly impactful one for the membership. Your association's leaders are committed to pushing back against these ill-advised and dangerous bills. We will actively oppose these bills and work closely with the other law enforcement associations in Sacramento to ensure that our elected representatives understand the harm these bills could inflict on peace officers, their departments and the public.

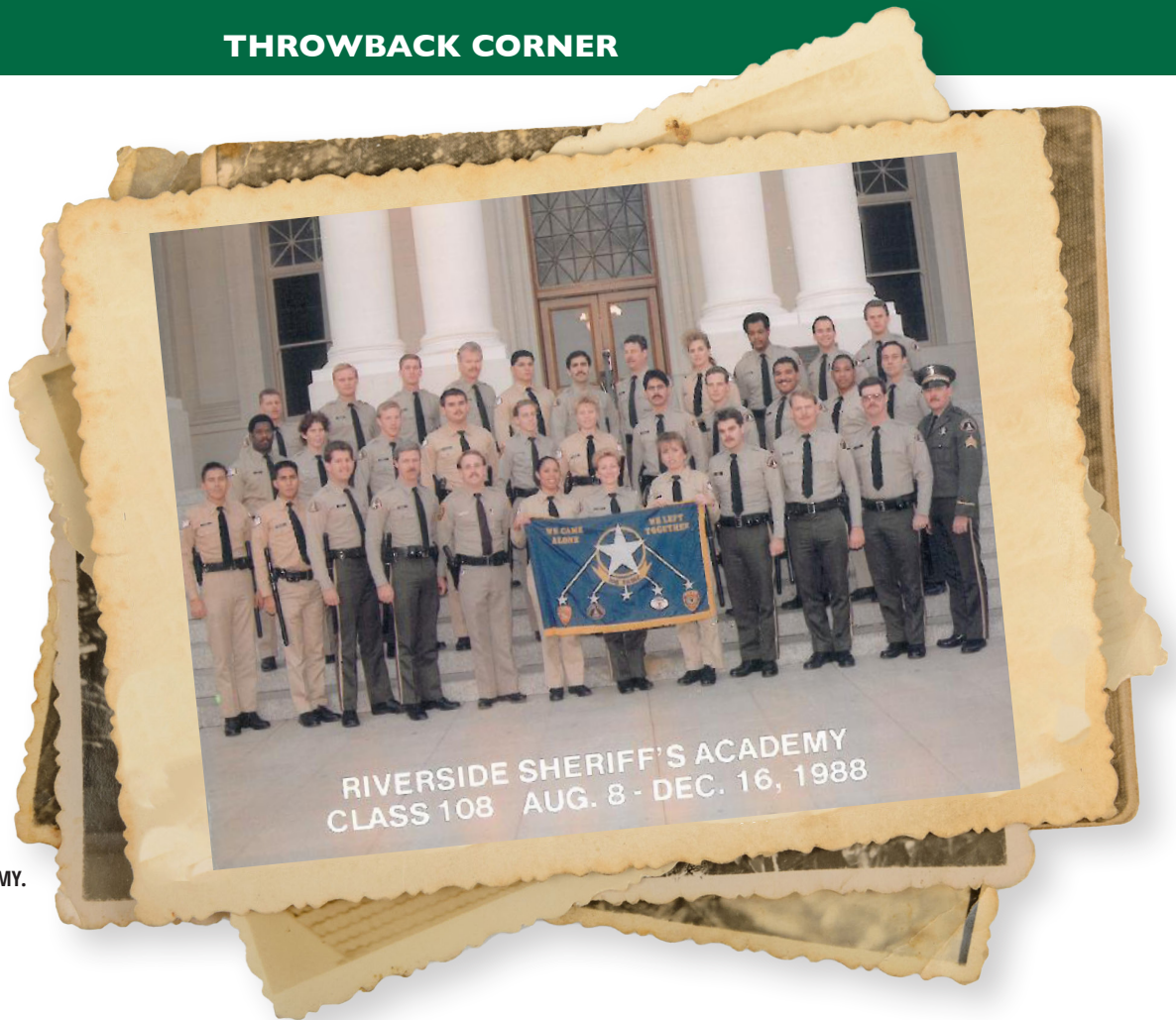

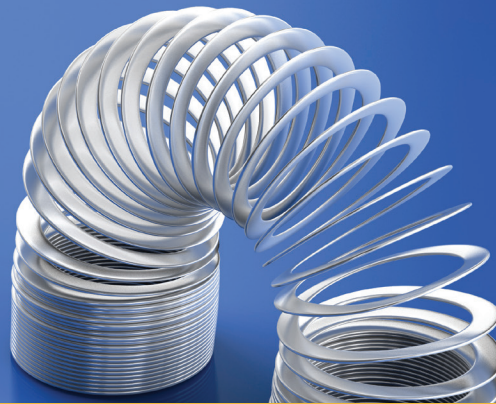
