RE: AB 2290 -- SIGN

Dear Governor Schwarzenegger:

The Riverside Sheriffs' Association, which represents more than 3,200 rank and file deputy sheriffs, deputy probation officers, law enforcement investigators and counselors, coroners and bailiffs, the entire law enforcement team in Riverside County, respectfully requests that you sign AB 2290 into law.

AB 2290 requires the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to provide local law enforcement with the date of a "non-revocable" parolee's scheduled release not less than 45 days prior to the inmate's release, or as soon as practicable. The information from CDCR to local law enforcement is to be made via the department's "LEADS" system and will enact non-codified legislative intent language concerning the provision of local services for parolees released from prison who are subject to revocation.

This measure is built on simple common sense accountability and will better enable the supervision of certain offenders at the local level with the legislatively stated goal of reducing criminal recidivism.

AB 2290 has broad support from the law enforcement community, and we ask that it be signed into law.
