## RSA Legal Defense Alert!!

Always consult with an association representative/lawyer before responding to any report, letter, memo and/or questions concerning an investigation that could possibly lead to punitive action. If ordered to do so, ask to have it recorded and read the following: Non-waiver statement:

"I have been refused the right to have a representative of my choice. I understand that I am being ordered to make a report or answer questions and that, if I do not comply with the order, I may be disciplined for insubordination. Therefore, I have no alternative but to abide by the order. However, by so doing, I do not waive my constitutional rights to remain silent under the 5th and 14th amendments to the United States Constitution and under the protections afforded me under state law."

## Tortellini Bake



**Cook Time: 30 Minutes**



**Prep: 15 Minutes**



**Serves: 4 - 6**

### **Ingredients:**

- 1 Package Cheese Tortellini (1LB)
- 1 Bag Fresh Broccoli Florets
- 1 Cup Shredded Mozzarella Cheese
- ¼ Cup Parmesan Cheese
- 4 Tbsp Olive Oil
- 1 Tbsp Garlic Powder
- 1 Tbsp Italian Seasoning
- Salt & Pepper to taste

### **Instructions:**

- Step 1: Pre-heat oven to 400 Degrees.
- Step 2: Bring a large pot of water to a boil and add in the tortellini. Cook until they are al dente.
- Step 3: Rinse broccoli florets well and chop in small chunks, adding them to large mixing bowl. Drain and add the cooked tortellini to the bowl.
- Step 4: Add the olive oil, garlic powder, Italian seasoning, salt & pepper and gently mix until well combined.
- Step 5: Place the mixture onto a sheet pan and sprinkle with the mozzarella & parmesan cheese.
- Step 6: Bake for 20 - 25 minutes, or until the cheese bubbles and is golden brown.
- Step 7: Allow to cool for a few minutes, serve & enjoy!
- Optional: You can add a protein to make this more filling, shredded chicken, Italian sausage, etc.

# A Look At The Legislation For The 2026 Session

**W**e now have our first look at all the legislation introduced for the remainder of the 2026 legislative session, with two caveats. First, scores of intent and spot bills remain which must be amended before the next deadline or they will automatically fail passage. Second, legislators retain the ability (with leadership approval) to “gut-and-amend” which permits them to resurrect bills which have either failed passage or introduce entirely new proposals outside the official legislative calendar deadlines.

The lists below are not all-inclusive as they do not reflect the intent/spot bills that will be amended shortly, nor do they include many dozens more bills we are “watching” that are currently innocuous, but due to their topic, we expect them to also be significantly amended - for good or bad - in the coming weeks.

In order to highlight the challenges facing law enforcement in our state’s Capitol, we’ve broken down our list of oppose and support bills into various categories. The bills on the oppose list will remain among our top priorities as we seek to educate lawmakers on the harms they will cause if enacted. We are also encouraged by the strong showing of good bills that seeks to assist law enforcement officers, better protect children and other crime victims, crack down on dangerous drugs, repeat DUI offenders and shady private prison operators, or generally improve public safety.

## OPPOSE CRIMINAL CODDLING

These bills tend to seek sentencing reductions or mitigation of other consequences related to criminal activity, often referred to as a hug-a-thug approach to criminal justice. Such legislation rarely takes into account the safety of their victims or that of the general public, hence our opposition to them.

## OPPOSE ANTI-LAW ENFORCEMENT

Legislation listed here is designed specifically to either make the job of peace officers more difficult and dangerous or to make policy pronouncements against controversial federal actions, thereby further reducing the ability of law enforcement agencies to attract new officers or increasing the personal liability of officers as a way to significantly reduce the number of sworn peace officers through accelerated resignations and retirements.



**SUPPORT FOR PEACE OFFICERS**

The thoughtful legislators here understand that law enforcement needs to be competitive in the labor market and that necessary equipment and protections be made available to our dedicated officers.

**SUPPORT PROTECTING CHILDREN**

As the saying goes, “The children are our future” and society must be better at protecting their safety, especially from those who would do them harm.

**SUPPORT DUI CHANGES**

Numerous investigative media reports over the last few months have highlighted the inadequacy of our state’s DUI laws. Many have noted that California has some of the most ineffective and lax DUI in the nation. A number of legislators have taken this new “revelation” to heart and the result has been a watershed of DUI-related bills addressing many of the shortcomings highlighted by the media reports.

**SUPPORT ANTI-PRIVATE PRISONS**

The Riverside Sheriffs’ Association has a lengthy history, going back at least 30 years, of supporting legislation intended to curtail the operations of private prisons and detention facilities. These

# A Delay Or Denial Can Create A Penalty

**The Workers' Compensation System has been misused by some employers/agents by treating the injured worker unfairly or badly in the delay or denial of treatment, or payments of lost wages.**

**T**his can violate the California Constitution, which mandates under Article 14, Section 4, that there is to be a complete system of workers' compensation. A part of that system is to cure or relieve the effects of the injury and compensate the worker for any disability that emanates from the work injury.

In addition to this mandate by the California Constitution, it became recognized that there is a large segment of certain exposures which are unique to various occupations such as peace officers and firefighters, where the work-related exposures can create very serious medical issues that require medical care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury, or need to compensate the worker for residual impairment that may emanate.

There is special legislation that establishes certain medical conditions can be presumed to be job related (the presumption can be destroyed if proper evidence is not established). Some employers and adjusters do not accept the presumption or medical evidence provided that shows the medical condition is job related.

In the year of 2023 special legislation was enacted Labor Code §5814.3 which can set a substantial penalty against the self-insured employer or carrier that unreasonably rejects a claim or delay of access to medical care. The penalty of §5814.3 can reach a level of \$50,000.00.

It is not unusual that the behavior of delay or denial occurs. Specific legislation of §5814.3 was enacted in year 2023 to handle these situations to motivate the adjuster to grant timely medical care.

When you have filed a claim of injury with the employer, they also have parameters that must be followed regarding acceptance or denial. The acceptance or denial can be based upon

the body parts to which the injury is claimed or type of injury.

The presumptions as to the compensable exposures causing injury can go beyond the last day of work depending upon the type of disease and the development or manifestation of same.

One of the areas of concern is the delay and or denial. This can cause great harm to the worker and potentially jeopardize their health, and their ability to continue with their career forever.

The goal of the penalty provisions is to try to force the employer or third party administrator to act timely and fairly. The implementation of the labor code reflects the unintentional or intentional act to delay or denial of the care. Labor Code §5814.3 places

a high level of responsibility upon the adjuster to timely provide the necessity for care to cure or relieve. This is in addition to other penalties that can be sought.

The penalty is for unreasonable delay or denial of benefits and this has to do with injuries or illnesses as set forth in Labor Code §3212 to §3213.2. The amount of the penalty can be five times the amount of benefits that was unreasonably delayed due to rejection of the liability to a maximum level of \$50,000.00.

The awareness the employer now has because of this enactment of 2023 should move them forward and avoid these delays and denials that may cause harm. Yet, even with this legislation, they at times will make these unreasonable denials. Therefore, it is imperative that when a delay or denial occurs, your

attorney who is working with you is in the position to educate the employer of Labor Code §5814.3. Not only as to the penalties created and imposed, but there may be further harm to the worker forcing them to be off work longer, or delay can increase the level of residual impairment of injured worker or he/she cannot do their substantial duties and has to retire. Labor Code §5814.3 is a win ap-

proach for the employer because it forces them to have attention and provide the care pursuant to California Constitution to cure or relieve the effects of the injuries. Even with the presumptions, it is imperative that a proper foundation of evidence be presented to the treating doctor and the doctors that are determining as to whether the condition is or is not job related. Your preparation is important, without it or understanding you will allow the employer to avoid and find ways to limit the current treatment that the California Constitution and Labor Code have indicated is a necessity. The fact that you have a presumption does not remove the substantial evidence that needs to be presented to the evaluating doctor and the forensic doctors as to causative factors. Be prepared so you are not put in a position of delay or denial. ★


