Lobbying For Our Members

ello everyone, I hope this message finds you and your family safe. As we ap-



proach the season of warmer weather and longer days, it's time to spring forward and prepare for the challenges and opportunities ahead.

RSA has been hard at work ensuring the recently approved terms and conditions are being appropriately implemented by the County. Additionally, your Vice President, Jose Santos, and I had the honor of traveling to our nation's Capital to represent you, and our members, on Capitol Hill. One of the key issues we advocated for during our meetings with legislators was the creation of a federal offense for anyone who deliberately attacks a law enforcement officer because of their profession. We also lobbied for a VA-style home loan program for public safety professionals, like the one available to our military members. This would greatly assist public safety professionals in affording housing within the communities they serve.

We were pleased to see bipartisan support for these issues during our discussions with legislators. However, while there is support on both sides of the aisle, these matters may take some time to become law, especially following the landmark success we had recently with reversing the Social Security Windfall Act.

During my time in D.C., it reinforced for me the importance of

During my time in D.C., it reinforced for me the importance of having a strong Political Action Fund (PAC).

having a strong Political Action Fund (PAC). I believe so strongly in the value of this fund that I have personally increased my voluntary contribution to \$25 per pay period. In the coming weeks, RSA will be launching a campaign encouraging all our members to consider increasing their voluntary contributions to the PAC. This fund is critical in allowing RSA to remain at the table, rather than simply being the subject of discussion. Our PAC is one of the most powerful tools we have in ensuring our voices are heard, helping to elect law enforcement and labor-friendly officials, and working to un-elect those who are not supportive of our profession.

Lastly, I want to update you on an important development within RSA. A few months ago, the RSA Board of Directors approved the formation of a Bylaws Ad-Hoc Committee tasked

with reviewing and updating the RSA Bylaws. Shortly, there will be a vote among the regular membership to approve these updates. I strongly support these proposed changes as they will allow us to stay current with RSA's best practices and continue to evolve in the best interests of our members.

Thank you for your ongoing dedication to your work and our collective mission. We are stronger when we stand together, and I look forward to the continued success and growth of RSA as we move forward.



to other terms and conditions of employment as prescribed by law.



- **Puff Pastry;** One sheet, thawed
- Fresh Spinach; 1 cup chopped (or 1/2 cup frozen, thawed & drained)
- Ham; 1/2 cup diced or cubed
- Swiss or Cheddar Cheese; 1/2 cup shredded
- Cream Cheese; 1/4 cup softened

- Egg; 1 whole egg (for egg wash)
- Garlic Powder; 1/2 teaspoon
- Black Pepper; 1/2 teaspoon
- **Dijon Mustard**; optional for extra flavor boost

Instructions:

Step 1: Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Step 2: Prepare filling. In a bowl, mix chopped spinach, diced ham, shredded cheese, cream cheese, garlic powder, black pepper, and Dijon mustard. Stir until well combined.

Step 3: Roll out puff pastry on a lightly floured surface and cut into 6 equal squares.

Step 4: Fill & Fold. Place a spoonful of the spinach-ham mixture in the center of each square. Fold opposite corners toward the middle and pinch lightly to seal, or fold into a triangle and crimp the edges with a fork.

Step 5: Brush with egg wash (beat 1 egg with a tablespoon of water) for a golden finish.

Step 6: Bake for 18-22 minutes or until golden brown and puffed.

Cool for 5 minutes before serving.

Enjoy these warm, flaky bites on their own or with a side of honey mustard or ranch dip! Would you like a variation, like making them vegetarian or adding more seasoning?



In Remembrance

Tribute to Robert "Bob" Todd

n Saturday, February 22, 2025, our community paid tribute to



our friend, esteemed colleague, legal counselor, mentor, Christian, and family man, Robert M. "Bob" Todd, after succumbing to a sudden illness. Bob was an exceptional lawyer, especially in his dedicated service to "Stone Busailah" labor clients and associations. His leadership, integrity, and unwavering commitment set a standard we will continue to uphold in his honor.

Robert Todd was an experienced litigator who specialized in labor relations representation and administrative appeals. Before entering the law field, he served as a law enforcement officer for the South Gate Police Department for 32 years, including 6 years as the Chief of Police. Bob's experience gave him a unique perspective from which to serve the legal needs of the public safety membership.

I have known Bob since 2008, when I met him during my assignment with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department Professional Standards Bureau. As a representative for the Department, I often sat opposite of him during administrative and criminal investigations, as he safeguarded the interests of employees who were being investigated for alleged policy violations, or possible civil and criminal rights violations. Rather than taking an adversarial stance during the interviews, Bob ensured his clients were afforded due process, established and defined truth to the matter, and maintained a solid moral compass throughout the process. I always enjoyed working with him. Bob was purely respected by the Professional Standards Bureau, and it was simple to understand.

My professional relationship with Bob continued after I left the Professional Standards Bureau. I was assigned to Major Crimes and Force Investigations Detail investigations, where once again, I would sit across the table from Bob and his clients. Bob maintained his decorum, knowledge of law, and professionalism, which allowed for anyone within range to develop, mature, and become better servants and individuals. I became an improved public servant when I worked with Bob.

In 2021 I retired from the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and was honored to serve as a labor representative for the members of the Riverside Sheriffs' Association. My duties included working jointly with the legal team from Stone Busailah, assisting the membership with any legal uncertainty that they might have encountered (on or off duty.) After so many years of being schooled by Stone Busailah's "finest" on the other side of the investigative table, I was now able to sit next to (or behind them) and enhance my path of professional growth! 2021 was a transitional year for me and it seemed like Bob Todd responded to many call-outs during my infancy stages at Riverside Sheriffs' Association Legal Defense Trust. True to form, with each call-out, and member interaction. Bob would take on the role of a field leader, a mentor, a compassionate humanitarian, and an effective professional attorney.

When we paid tribute to Bob on February 22, those in attendance made it clear that Bob truly gave his all to his family, his community, his church, his profession, and his friends. Law enforcement officials, public safety officials, politicians, family, friends, fellow church members, and colleagues all gathered to celebrate the legacy that Bob provided us. His legacy will continue to set the standard for all that is good and right.



Priority Bills: Criminals, Cops, Victims & Drugs

he first couple of hearings held by the Assembly Public



Safety Committee this year have made clear that the current committee chair and members are taking a different approach to public safety legislation.

Bills to crack down on criminals, enhance protections for victims of crime and improve the ability of peace officers to perform their duties have already advanced from the committee. This stands in stark contrast to related measures that have been swiftly rejected in years past.

We have also identified approximately two dozen bills that have the potential to benefit criminals, expand intoxicating drug use, and impair law enforcement operations.

For 2025, more than 200 bills relating to law enforcement, public safety, crimes and victims are being tracked. We have weighed in on about half of these bills so far, with many more positions to be determined over the coming weeks as the remaining spot and intent bills are amended to include substantive language.

The Library Of Information Provides You With Protection

In the Library of Information at website Law1199.com there are numerous articles that review the workers' compensation, retirement and impact of an injury, medical care, levels of disability, continued employment and forms of communication.

hese articles are a source of information to garner pathways that can be utilized to obtain and protect medical care and other benefits.

Article 2021, Issue #12 titled Knowledge is Power for Treatment specifies the recognition that the worker must have an awareness of the two types of injuries that the workers' compensation system has embraced; specific and cumulative trauma. The awareness of those injuries and the mechanism or possible injuries is helpful for the worker to appreciate the factors of employment that may be contributing to a job-related injury.

There are different doctors utilized in the workers' compensation system, a treating doctor and a forensic type doctor. The forensic doctor evaluates the etiology of the injury and comments upon the need for time off, need for returning back to work, levels of impairment and whether the worker can continue with their employment.

In the 2021 Newsletter #12, Knowledge Is Power For Treatment, acknowledgment that there are some doctors that are engaging in what is called "catch and release programs". They quickly do their evaluation, review records and go in and release the worker from the office. This enhances the income flow for the doctor. This is not the case in all situations, but does exist. If the worker is prepared to cover certain areas such as the mechanism of injury, whether it is a specific or a cumulative trauma the worker can articulate to the doctor those factors. Those factors are the foundation of whether the medical condi-

tion is or is not job-related. Therefore, preparation prior to the treatment and/or the forensic evaluations is important to ensure these elements are covered.

In the Newsletter 2022, Issue #11 titled Balanced Communication with the Doctor reflects that the treating doctor indeed does have a different role than the forensic doctor. The treating doctor and the forensic evaluation physician will use the subjective complaints as articulated by the worker, look at the objective findings and then derive their diagnoses and potentially forms of treatment.

Subjective comments are the worker's perception as to typically the pain and discomfort that they have and what may make the subjective complaints less prominent, such as forms of treatment.

Therefore, the worker's part of their evaluation should have a broad spectrum as to what pain and discomfort they have. And, typically as articulated the pain and discomfort

can vary with good days and bad days. Expressing the good days and bad days creates a wall of protection regarding veracity. The failure that occurs at times is the worker will only focus on the bad days and if that is the case, that allows the adjusting agency to seek out a review as to the veracity by showing there are factors of other activities that the worker does on a good day but did not share that with the all the doctors, treating and forensic.

The key element is not to overstate or understate the subjective complaints, but a balanced communication as to what you can or cannot do, or what you have to modify.

The balanced communication is with the forensic evaluators and the treaters. Prior to meeting with the treater or the evaluators the worker should give thought as to good days and bad days and the articulation of same.

In addition to the awareness of your subjective complaints it is important to articulate with the doctor and staff that there is a cordial relationship. If the worker goes into the office and is angry, hostile and has a belligerent attitude towards the doctor and staff, this will unfortunately color the report in a manner that is not helpful. It is not that the doctor is trying to get back at the injured worker, but it can impact their perspective.

Article 2024, Issue #7 titled Impacts on Medical Care, Employment and Disability reinforces the idea of the relationship of a good communication with the treating or examining doctors and their staff. This element

will allow the doctor and staff to garner a complete history of the mechanism of injury, the subjective complaints, what the worker can or cannot do, and what they have to modify. The impact is on the medical care, time off of work, and residual impairment, and the very important history of pain and limit on good days and bad days.

The medical care by the California Constitution is to cure or relieve the effects of the job-related injury; this medical care can be expansive and lifelong.

The next article is 2023; Issue #9 titled Medical Care for Preexisting Conditions. If the worker had a condition that existed prior to the job-related injury and that medical condition becomes more symptomatic due to the injury or treatment from the injury, this may be the responsibility of the employer to provide for the care needed that emanated from the injury, and provide care due to increased and/

or changes to a preexisting condition because of the job-related injury.

In your preparation review the website called WebMD. The website has an area where you can look up the medications that you are taking and look for the side effects. Therefore if you are taking a medication for the job-related injury and you have the side effects from that medication that you are taking, it would be appropriate to share that information with the doctor if there are side effects. By doing so, the doctor can articulate that and if that condition continues to be more problematic or you need to continue with the care this could award you lifetime medical on that condition caused or made worse by the job-related medication.

Recently, we had the case that was resolved many years ago, and we advised the client that there is the right of five years to open the case from the date of injury. In this situation, the condition became more symptomatic. The client advised us of that and we filed a Petition to Reopen for New and Further Disability. Unfortunately for the client there has been a change in disability, he will receive additional compensation for that because he gave us the appropriate information which was that the condition had become more symptomatic since we resolved the case, and the information was provided within the five year window. (2019, Issue #1 Protection for Injured Workers' Under the Five-Year Window)

There are certain medical conditions in which we can get a special order from the court that grants the condition is insidious and progressive. These typically are cancer cases. If the court grants an order that the condition is insidious and progressive there is no five year limitation. If there is a court finding that is an insidious and progressive and the jurisdiction is

reserved there is no limitation to reopen the case. Reopening the case goes to the level of impairment, we do not need to have the benefit of reopening the case to increase the level of medical care. But if having the medical care increased and it is within that five year limit there is a high probability that there is an increase in permanent disability. Therefore you will receive a letter from us indicating that you have a five year window. (2019, Issue #1 Protection for Injured Workers' Under the Five- Year Window Insidious and Progressive)

An awareness as to the five year window is set forth in Newsletter Article 2021, Issue #6. Besides the current information there are many articles that are written that come back with studies indicating that there may be additional changes in the medical care. In Newsletter Article 2024, Issue #14 a new study has come out and is one that the International Association of Research on Cancer has found that certain types of medications can be a carcinogen and a carcinogen is a factor in causing cancer. In that study that they have done indicates that there are medications taken for hypertension indeed can be a carcinogen. It is important that as you become aware of this you share that with your doctor. The doctors may not be in a position where they want to embrace it because it is a new article, but you are putting them on notice. You need to monitor what is going on with your health, and if in

fact there is a change such as the cancer causing factor, this could be brought within the workers' compensation if the hypertension medication that you are taking is because of a job-related injury.

In Newsletter Article 2024, Issue #14 titled Can Medication For Hypertension Be A Factor In Causing Cancer there is a discussion that you should go to WebMD and look at the risk factors and side effects of medications.

Your preparation is paramount regarding your ability to communicate with the doctor. Your understanding as to the subjective factors and not overstating, but not understating, is also a significant element. The relationship that you have with the treating doctor and staff is a factor that helps the doctor to move forward to provide with medical care to cure or relieve.

The physicians are not paid additional compensation to go into indepth studies. If the doctor and the staff like their patients, there is an emotional motivation that they could take additional steps necessary to get the medical care to cure or relieve the effects of the injury. Knowledge is the power for treatment, knowledge is the power to show that the condition is job-related, knowledge is the power to either continue with your employment or be in a position where you can garner a disability retirement. Knowledge is something that will develop the case and your understanding in grasping of same makes more effective communication. *
