### **RSA Legal Defense Alert!!**

Always consult with an association representative/lawyer before responding to any report, letter, memo and/or questions concerning an investigation that could possibly lead to punitive action. If ordered to do so, ask to have it recorded and read the following: Non-waiver statement

"I have been refused the right to have a representative of my choice. I understand that I am being ordered to make a report or answer questions and that, if I do not comply with the order, I may be disciplined for insubordination.

Therefore, I have no alternative but to abide by the order. However, by so doing, I do not waive my constitutional rights to remain silent under the 5th and 14th amendments to the United States Constitution and under the protections afforded me under state law."

# 23rd Annual DCMF Charity **Golf Tournament**

his marks the 23rd year that the Debbie Chisholm Memorial Foundation (DCMF) has put on a charity golf tournament and raffle event to raise money to help children in need in the Inland Empire. DCMF incorporated in July of 1994 and has since raised over \$1,500,000 through fundraising events and private donations. The Debbie Chisholm Memorial Foundation is dedicated to granting wishes to seriously ill children within the Inland Empire, making it Southern California's only law-enforcement based wish granting charity.

The Nov. 3 tournament held at the Morongo Golf Club in Tukwet Canyon hosted 60 participants from area law enforcement agencies who played and bought a ton of raffle tickets to win some great prizes, including NFL signed helmets, driver clubs, a ring alarm system, a 60" flat screen TV with surround sound and unique gift baskets.

DCMF raised more than \$10,000 which will be used during the Spirit of Christmas, a program where they deliver a complete Christmas to several families who have catastrophically ill children at home. They receive gifts for all family members along with food cards and a decorated tree if needed.

Trophies were handed out to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams with the best scores. Other trophies included the "Most Honest" team, Longest Drive, and Closest To The Pin.





A special thank you also to our friends at SafetyNet, Inc, in Riverside, who generously donated toys to the RSA toy drive! ★












# The Making Of A Sheriff

he historic election of Lt. Chad Bianco as the Sheriff-elect of Riverside County should never have happened.



Incumbent sheriffs rarely fail to win re-election. In fact, over the last 100 years, only one other sheriff was removed from office by the voters - and that happened more than 50 years ago.

Similarly, no lieutenant had ever been elected Sheriff in Riverside County.

Bianco didn't simply defy the odds. He made history. Here is how it happened.

Back in 2014, the RSA helped to oust another incumbent by successfully backing District Attorney Mike Hestrin in his challenge to then- DA Paul Zellerbach.

Sniff was up for re-election that year as well and the RSA endorsed Sniff, but did not provide him with the financial support he received from the association in his prior 2010 election. From what we've heard, the RSA's refusal to make large contributions to Sniff's 2014 re-elect campaign was the turning point in the RSA-Sniff relationship.

Over the years, Sniff had collected more than \$140,000 from the RSA and was extremely unhappy that the RSA didn't do more to support his re-election.

In January 2015, Sniff was sworn in for his third term as sheriff. That same month, Sniff decided that he no longer needed to follow state law or the RSA / Riverside County Contract by meeting with and discussing proposed changes to terms and conditions of employment for Riverside County Deputy Sheriffs. Sniff made it crystal clear to the RSA leadership that he would no longer adhere to past agreed-upon issues. Instead, Sniff believed that his 2014 election showed that he no longer needed the support of the RSA. Therefore, he decided he would simply ignore the issues and concerns of thousands of his own employees. Sniff's dramatic change in

leadership style was the beginning of the end for the 40-year lawman.

Over the next four years, Sniff repeatedly demonstrated his disdain for his employees, except for his hand-picked executive staff to whom he doled out huge pay raises.

In 2015, the RSA Board of Directors announced that they had preemptively pulled their endorsement of Sniff which had dated back to 2007. That same year, the RSA began to collect and organize what would become a voluminous "opposition research" dossier on Sniff.

The groundwork was laid and Sniff's negative issues were identified.

## JANUARY 2017 - SNIFF'S VULNERABILITY TESTED

Eighteen months prior to the June 2018 primary, the RSA commissioned a public opinion poll to test the issues most likely to sway voters away from Sniff. We expected the results to show that Sniff was well-known in the county and that the negative issues we collected would cause significant harm to his re-election efforts. The results showed that an overwhelming majority of voters had no idea who Sniff was. Moreover, voters strongly opposed many of the issues, positions, and actions of the Sniff administration, with 70-80% voters refusing to support him.

With these results, we knew we had a really good chance to help voters elect a new sheriff.

### **APRIL, 2017 - CANDIDATE INTERVIEWS**

The RSA Political Action Committee and Board of Directors interviewed a handful of potential candidates interested in challenging Sniff in the June 2018 primary.

# JUNE / JULY - THE RSA BOARD OF DIRECTORS ENDORSE BIANCO

The RSA Board also authorized a significant campaign contribution to the Bianco campaign at this time. The contribution gave Bianco instant credibility and viability as a serious candidate.

### OCTOBER, 2017 - PROFESSIONAL CAMPAIGN Consultancy retained

GBA hired. RSA had worked closely in the past with GBA, including the successful election of then-Riverside County Supervisor Jeff Stone to the California State Senate. GBA knew Riverside County well.

### NOVEMBER, 2018 - SLATE MAILERS PURCHASED

The RSA Board of Directors voted to approve the purchase, on behalf of the Chad Bianco for Sheriff campaign committee, of a number of slate mailers that registered voters receive throughout each election. Democratic and Republicanoriented "Voter Guides" were purchased, in addition to slates that focus on issues such as the Environment, Women, Education, Latinos, Taxpayer Protection, Public Safety, Government Efficiency, Conservative, and Liberal topics. In total, over 1.5 million of these slate cards were sent to Riverside County high-propensity voters in April and May, 2018. This was a cost-effective way to boost Bianco's name in front of voters in time for the June election.

# DECEMBER, 2017 - INFORMAL "MEET & GREET" EVENTS

Bianco spends his free time away from work meeting with numerous elected officials, political, community, and civic groups throughout the county as a way of introducing himself to these well-connected supporters and important organizations. Other "Meet & Greets" were scheduled for the first three months of 2018. RSA representatives also met with elected leaders and associations throughout Riverside as part of our effort to explain why the men and women of RSA are seeking new leadership for the sheriff's department and why the best candidate for the job is Chad Bianco.

### JANUARY/FEBRUARY -THEN THERE WERE FOUR

Unknown RivCo deputy Miguel Garcia becomes the fourth candidate in

this race for county sheriff. Meanwhile, Bianco's available time away from work becomes scarce as he travels throughout the county. Campaign contribution reports are published, showing Sniff with a sizable lead in in campaign cash. Newspapers and social media pages highlight Sniff's electoral advantages over Bianco. Neither Garcia nor Brown were viewed as viable candidates. In political circles, it was becoming clear that this race would boil down to Sniff and Bianco.

### MARCH, 2018 - BIANCO CAMPAIGN ADS RELEASED

The Bianco team releases its first campaign commercial on both network and cable tv. The ad introduced Bianco to the voters, showing him working with law enforcement, touting his experience, and making the case for new leadership. The ad is very well received. The social media ad campaign was also launched.

# APRIL, 2018 - POLLING RESULTS & ABSENTEE BALLOTS MAILED

A quick summary here. The polling reinforced our results from 2017 and showed that when voters are educated about Sniff's massive failures as sheriff, they will abandon him in droves.

Our confidence in the campaign strategy continued to grow. Hundreds of thousands of slates were arriving in the mailboxes of the absentee/vote-by-mail voters, reinforcing Bianco's name ID in conjunction with the tv ads.

# MAY, 2018 - BIANCO UNDER ATTACK, NEW POLL RESULTS. TV BUY INCREASED

Both Brown and Sniff sent mail to voters claiming Bianco is unqualified to serve as sheriff. Sniff also hit Brown for being the failed former police chief of Hemet - the most crime-ridden city in the county.

However, our tracking poll showed Bianco in the lead by a couple points followed by Sniff, Garcia, and Brown. The majority of voters remained undecided, but the numbers had increased. Importantly, the tv ads appeared to be working because voter support for Sniff dropped by more than 50%.

Sniff continued to raise money, collecting over \$100,000 during the month. During this last month of the campaign, Sniff began telling his friends and supporters that his polling showed him winning his re-election outright with 53% of the vote.

The final weeks of May also saw the Bianco tv ad buy significantly increased with the release of the second tv ad by Bianco. This ad highlighted Sniff's involvement in the promotional exam cheating controversy, his serious mismanagement of our tax dollars, his refusal to stem the tide of dangerous criminals being released back into the communities and crime increased.

### JUNE 2018 - WE'RE NUMBER ONE!

The June primary election results were historic. Bianco received 14,000 more votes than "second place Sniff." Sniff was forced into a runoff November election for the first time in his career. Miguel Garcia disappeared from public life and Dave Brown promptly endorsed Bianco for the general election. Immediately after the

election, Sniff blamed his poor showing on low voter turnout and that not enough of his supporters went to the polls. It soon became clear that the June 2018 primary election had one of the largest voter turnouts in recent memory. Sniff's voters had in fact cast ballots - just not for him.

When his voter turnout claim fizzled, Sniff switched his story, claiming that the union spent heavily on false, deceptive ads attacking the men and women of the department. While it's true that the Bianco campaign spent a lot of money on tv, Sniff was unable to point to anything in the ads that was false.

By mid-June, Sniff was telling his staff and big donors that Bianco was out of money and would be easily defeated in November. In reality, it was Sniff's resources that began to dry up as many of his longtime donors stopped taking his calls. Those donors saw what everyone else in Riverside County saw - 68% of the voters rejected Sniff in the primary.

### JULY, 2018

Endorsements begin rolling in for Bianco. Members of Sniff's own executive staff abandon the sheriff and publicly announce their support for Bianco.

### **AUGUST, 2018**

Bianco billboards go up throughout the county in an effort to keep his name fresh in voters' minds during a traditionally slow time for campaigns.

# SEPTEMBER, 2018 - FUNDRAISING, TV, & POLING

Unlike the primary election, just a few slates were purchased for Bianco for November. The bulk of the campaign resources were instead dedicated to the tv ad buy. RSA representatives had been putting a concerted effort into fostering and maintaining relationships with a variety of elected officials from the state Senate and Assembly, local government, as well as prominent business leaders, organizations, and especially our brothers and sisters in law enforcement associations throughout the county and across the state.

Of note, desert businessman and philanthropist Alex Haagen held a fundraiser for Bianco at his Empire Polo Club and also made a truly generous donation to the Bianco campaign in the amount of \$50,000. At that same event, Terry Hammon, a local chapter president and political action committee member with the California Correctional Peace Officers Association, handed Bianco a check for \$100,000. The politically powerful CCPOA represents nearly 30,000 correctional officers, counselors, and parole agents of the California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation. They recognized the harm Sniff had been inflicting on his own employees and decided to support our effort to elect a new sheriff.

During the frist week in September, we learned that Chad was ahead of Sniff by 9%, although a large portion of voters remained undecided. Sniff's attack ads against Bianco were all over network tv, covering the entire county. Meanwhile, the Bianco camp continued to air the successful tv ads from the primary, giving voters an opportunity to re-acquaint themselves with Bianco's name and candidacy.

The campaign team returned again to Riverside to film a couple more campaign commercials. This time, actual peace officers from the Riverside Sheriffs Department and other law enforcement agencies were the stars of the ad, providing brief testimonials in support of Bianco for sheriff.

The campaign also filmed peace officers detailing the failures of Sniff and

his administration - warning voters to not be fooled by Sniff's false attack ads.

Our final substantive poll of the election was conducted towards the end of the month and showed that Bianco was now known to 50% of the voters, while eleven-year incumbent Sniff was known to just 47%. It was truly astonishing that after campaigning for the prior four years, a previously unknown lieutenant was now better known than the sheriff.

However, when asked who they would vote for if the election were held today, Sniff and Bianco were essentially tied. It seemed Sniff's attack ads had been working. As we dug deeper into the poll, we noticed that voters who claimed to strongly support Sniff were quite low and the bulk of his support was from voters who were leaning towards him, but remained open-minded.

On the bright side, we learned that when positive and negative information about each candidate was provided, Sniff's numbers dropped significantly and Bianco easily surpassed the 50% mark. The campaign had all the information it needed to ensure a Bianco victory.

# OCTOBER, 2018 - OUTSIDE POLLING, NEW AD RELEASED, SELF-INFLICTED SNIFF

The positive law enforcement personnel ad was an incredible success with the voters. By the third week of October, polling by other groups had Bianco up 13%.

When the Bianco campaign re-booted for the last two months, the goal was to stay as positive as possible. The national elections were becoming toxic and the campaign decided to stay positive unless it was forced to hit back. Bianco stayed positive for the remainder of the campaign, airing only the positive law enforcement officer ad. It was professional, had a simple, yet strong message of cooperation, looking forward to improving the safety and the lives of Riverside County residents.

As he did since the restart of his campaign in September, Sniff remained in attack mode, launching negative tv and social media ads against Bianco for the final weeks of the campaign. Sniff knew he was losing to Bianco, so he initiated a "Hail Mary" strategy of attacking Bianco 24/7 on tv, social media, mail, and public events.

Sniff was running out of time to persuade enough voters to make a difference. Many voters had already cast their ballots, and those who had not yet voted were barraged with the constant drone of negative ads, which created a huge backlash against Sniff.

To many observers, Sniff was becoming unhinged. His rants and fits of anger were increasingly directed at members of his own campaign team and his employees at the sheriff's office. His "Hail Mary" plan was failing spectacularly.

### NOVEMBER, 2018 - ELECTION DAY & FINAL VOTE COUNT

Only one other time in the last 100 years have Riverside County voters thrown out a sitting sheriff, and that occurred over 50 years ago. Voters rejected Sniff's negative politics and overwhelmingly backed Bianco to replace him. Never in the history of Riverside County has a lieutenant ever been elected sheriff, much less defeat an incumbent. Bianco didn't simply squeeze out a win on election night - he trounced Sniff by more than 17%. Sheriff-elect Bianco received more than 94,000 votes than Sniff.

### **POST SCRIPT**

Sniff's downfall may be viewed as a cautionary tale for those who serve in positions of power. Such positions, whether elected, appointed, or achieved by personal sacrifice and fortitude must always be treated as positions of service. Whether in the halls of government or the boardrooms of corporations, the singular purpose of these prestigious positions of honor and respect is to implement all of your skills and abilities in such a manner as to maximize the benefit the organization.

When leaders come to believe that they are more important than the employees and organization they serve, the time is at hand for them to ride off into the sunset - or risk being run out town. Choose wisely.

This Christmas season, I am truly honored and blessed for the opportunity to serve the men and women of the Riverside Sheriffs' Association. As 2019 approaches, I look forward to the new year and the possibilities that will unfold. Congratulations to Sheriff-Elect Bianco!

# SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR RIVERSIDE SHERIFF'S ASSOCIATION LEGAL DEFENSE TRUST

This is a summary of the annual report of the Riverside Sheriff's Association Legal Defense Trust, E.I.N. 33-6200313, Plan No. 501, for the year ended December 31, 2017. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### **Basic Financial Statement**

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$4,179,714 as of December 31, 2017, compared to \$3,761,365 as of January 1, 2017. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$418,349. This increase includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year, or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$1,813,771 including employer contributions of \$1,529,277, realized gain of \$14,405 from the sale of assets and earnings from investments of \$270,089.

Plan expenses were \$1,395,422. These expenses included \$410,097 in administrative expenses and \$985,325 in benefits paid to or for participants and beneficiaries.

- 1. An independent auditors' report;
- 2. financial information and information on payments to service providers; and
  - 3. assets held for investment.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan (21810 Cactus Avenue, Riverside, CA 92518) and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
